Dear Member:

The Cranberry Lake Boat Club has accomplished more this year, of actual benefit to members and to this region of the Adirondacks, than in any previous year.

To date, five permanent buoys and three flashers have been placed at key points in the Lake.

The buoys are anchored with 300 lbs. of concrete. A twenty foot log-chain is attached to this anchor and on the upper end there is a cedar post. These parts of the buoys will remain permanently in the Lake. During the summer, a white wooden marker will be attached to the buoy.

The gasoline drum markers have proved unsatisfactory. Hunters shoot holes in them so they sink and they lack the durability of wood.

The buoy at Union Point was probably shot down during last hunting season. It will be a few weeks before we can recover the anchorage and place a new marker there.

An additional marker will be placed opposite the dock at Buck Island whenever the obstruction there can be located. This spot is not dangerous in high water.

We have secured a part time boat for the Game Protector. We had the Lake examined last fall by the Conservation experts to learn what effect, if any, low water had on trout spawning beds. Their report indicates no damage.

We are looking forward to a bigger and better year; to the Regatta on Saturday August 10th and the Annual Banquet to be held about ten days after the Regatta, at which many more interesting activities of the Club will be fully discussed and plans made for the future. Determine now, to attend both events.

The expenses of improvements made by the Club must be met largely from membership dues, which are \$3.00 per year.

The prompt remittance of your dues, to the Secretary, Geo. A. Terry, Cranberry Lake, N. Y., will greatly aid your officers in carrying out their plans to make this a much safer lake for our families and our boats.

The accomplishment of the Club's ideals is only possible by the co-operation of both permanent and summer residents. Your officers are giving their time and energy for the benefit of all, let's pull together.
