I am happy to report that the water levels in the lake are returning to normal after days of high water and notable dock damage for many. The Boat Club Board had its first meeting on May 29 and plans for summer activities were finalized. Of major note was the decision to have our annual meeting prior to the banquet at the Cranberry Lake Lodge on July 9. We shall begin the meeting at 3:00 p.m. and move into the reception at 4:30 p.m. before our dinner. Please complete the banquet reservation form attached as part of this newsletter. Thanks to Virginia Myers and Patty Farnsworth for coordinating the details.

As you know from the Spring 2011 newsletter, we have new water quality research activities underway during this summer. Eric Paul from Paul Smiths College is the Boat Steward stationed at the public launch site on Columbian Road. He has already started work and will be at that location on Fridays through Tuesdays from 7:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. He will be talking with people about problems related to invasive species and looking at boats. His role is to increase public awareness and is part of a larger project that includes several other Adirondack lakes. The work is part of a Great Lakes Restoration Initiative grant. Please stop and introduce yourself to Eric. I have asked him to attend our annual meeting and report on his work. Also, Brad Baldwin from St.

Lawrence University will be doing water testing during different times of the year. Brad will also attend our annual meeting. The Boat Club will continue its own annual studies as part of the Adirondack Lakes Assessment Program run by Paul Smiths College.

For those of you who use the parking lot behind the Community Center in Cranberry Lake, there are some changes you should be aware of as you plan ahead. Parking behind the building will be restricted to allow new paving to be done. Work is slated to begin on June 20 with the space anticipated to reopen for use by July 4. Once it is completed there will be parking for many more vehicles and trailers. During the interim, it is suggested that you park at the public launch site.

Another development of interest is the arrival of David Martin, a boat mechanic from SUNY Canton who has been employed by the Cranberry Lake Lodge to provide boat service and repair. David is located in the building next to the large storage barn across from the Lodge.

The dock area at the Lodge has been expanded and a bait shop is in process. It will be located in the front section of the Lodge facing the highway.
