The Cranberry Lake Board of Directors has approved the production of a new navigation map and is working with the company Adirondack Research to design and publish the Cranberry Lake Navigation Map.

Adirondack Research is a contract environmental firm with a focus on invasive species. Both the CLBC and Adirondack Research share the same mission: stewardship for lakes. They produce a line of recreation and way-finding maps under the brand Green Goat Maps. Samples of other maps they have done can be seen at greengoatmaps.com.

The Boat Stickers are in! They are GREEN. Hopefully this is a symbol that we are going to have a good 2021 summer season!




